ABSTRACT

BIOGRAPHY

Vladimir Mitin has been a Professor and Chair in the Department of Electrical Engineering at the University at Buffalo, State University of New York since August 2003. During 1993-2003 he was a Professor in the Department of Electrical and Computer Engineering at Wayne State University in Detroit, Michigan. His fields of specialization are nanoelectronic, microelectronic and optoelectronic devices and materials. He has more than 390 publications including four monographs and three textbooks. He obtained his Doctor of Science degree in 1987 from the Institute of Semiconductors of Ukrainian Academy of Sciences in Kiev, Ukraine.

Wayne Anderson has been in the Department since 1978 after teaching for 8 years at Rutgers University. He is now Professor and Director of Graduate Studies in the Department, and director of the Microelectronic Fabrication Laboratory. His research interests are semiconductor thin films, photovoltaics, photo-detectors, thin film deposition and electronic devices.
